At its public meeting on July 20, 2011, the court considered and approved amendments to Bar Rules of Procedure 1.11 to create a limited exemption from the requirement that all OSB members provide an e-mail address. The proposed rule is set out below. Deleted text is in brackets and italics, new text is underlined:

Rule 1.11 [*Contact Information*] Designation of Contact Information.

(a) All attorneys must designate, on a form approved by the Oregon State Bar, a current business address and telephone number, or in the absence thereof, a current residence address and telephone number. A post office address designation must be accompanied by a street address.


(b) All attorneys must also designate an e-mail address for receipt of bar notices and correspondence except attorneys who are over the age of 65 and fully retired from the practice of law and attorneys for whom reasonable accommodation is required by applicable law. For purposes of this rule an attorney is "fully retired from the practice of law" if the attorney does not engage at any time in any activity that constitutes the practice of law including, without limitation, activities described in OSB bylaws 6.100 and 20.2.

(c) An attorney seeking an exemption from the e-mail address requirement for the reasons stated in paragraph (b) must submit a written request to the Executive Director, whose decision on the request will be final.

([b] d) It is the duty of all attorneys promptly to notify the Oregon State Bar in writing of any change in his or her contact information. A new designation shall not become effective until actually received by the Oregon State Bar.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the proposed Bar Rule of Procedure 1.11 be approved immediately.
